The "point" of the heart-shaped track is the direction the deer was moving.

Deer travel the same paths often, creating 6-24 inch wide trails.

Look for clusters of pellets that have a dimple on one end and a point on the other end.



Beds



Beds are where deer lie down. Look for ovals where leaves, grass, or snow are pressed down. Bucks rub their antlers on trees to remove the velvet (skin) and to mark territory.
